On Sunday morning, December 7, 1941, the USS New Orleans was tied up at dock 1010 Pearl Harbor, Hawaii. As the bombing raids ensued, sailors on the New Orleans had formed lines of men to carry ammunition up through the quarter deck of the deck guns. The officer in charge of the Ammo line stated that he heard a voice behind him saying, "PRAISE THE LORD AND PASS THE AMMUNITION". He turned and saw Chaplain Lt. Howell Forgy moving down the line patting the men on the back and making that remark to cheer the men on. The officer stated that hearing the Chaplain helped him keep going.

So this morning we are asking you to join us to stand Shoulder to Shoulder with LMSG to pass the ammunition.
