

"Why Is Jesus' Resurrection Significant for ME?"

Scriptural answers to questions people often wonder about Christianity.

It was refreshing, though the situation certainly wasn't. Sandy's mom had spent a wonderful, joy-filled day with her and her ten-month-old daughter. But it took just one moment. What started as a minor health scare quickly escalated, resulting in an emergency trip to the hospital. Less than two days later, Sandy's mother went home to heaven.

They weren't ready to lose her. If they had their way, she'd still be alive. So what was refreshing? "God's will be done." "I'm glad she is in Jesus' arms." Throughout the entire tragedy, that's what Sandy wrote.

How could she be so upbeat? In the midst of mourning, she was a modern-day Martha. Martha, fighting through tears for her brother Lazarus, freshly laid in the grave, boldly proclaimed to Jesus, "I know he will rise again in the resurrection at the last day" (John 11:24).

How could she be so confident? How can I be so confident? As a result of Adam and Eve's first sin, death was introduced into the world. As a result of sin, I've lost loved ones. As a result of sin, I myself will lose my life one day. And as a result of my sin, God tells me there's only one place where I deserve to go, hell.

How can I be so confident? Because I have a loving Savior. Where I struggle and fail each day to love and obey God, Jesus didn't ever fail. Even when loving God meant dying for me, Jesus obeyed. His love for me took him to the cross. His love has taken away all the guilt of my sins.

How can I be so confident? Because I have a living Savior. Jesus died, but he's not dead. His resurrection is more than just an occasion to commemorate once a year on Easter. It's the proof that Jesus not only forgave my sins and conquered hell, it's also the promise that because he lives, I also will live. When I die, in his loving and living arms, I will live!

Jesus' resurrection gives me confidence. It makes me confident to say, "I know that my Redeemer lives." I am refreshed in every joy and every sorrow because I know that my Redeemer lives. And when at last my earthly journey is done, I will wake to live forever with my Savior because my Redeemer lives.





PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

With Easter approaching and the Christians everywhere preparing for family gatherings and worship services, we are nearing the time of the year in which we couldn't be more proud to be Christ's followers. Of course, during all times of the year we represent Christ and worship him as his followers, but this time of year it seems to be amplified. Being a representative of Christ is quite the responsibility and privilege, though it also includes its challenges.

There was a time or two from my childhood when I disappointed my parents. During my adolescence, I remember how I embarrassed my mother as she was attending one of my baseball games. Once we got home, she told me in a very loud conversation how my behavior had reflected badly on her in front of the other parents. At the game, I had made a poor decision to talk roughly with the other guys and it had its consequences on not just me, but also my mother. I had poorly represented my family.

At Zion Lutheran School, we get to speak of God's undeserved love for us and how we are now part of his flock. Students love hearing that they are wanted by their Heavenly Father and "called to be his own". They enjoy representing our school by singing in front of church or wearing the uniform on the basketball court after a win. These are scenarios in which representing God is convenient and easily enjoyed.

Unfortunately, there are times when we wish we could take a timeout from representing God because we are upset with a friend, pressured by peers, or exhausted with responsibility. You can agree that it is more difficult to represent God after losing a basketball game than after a win. Turning the other cheek is a great rule of thumb until you are infuriated. These are scenarios in which positively representing God is difficult.


We wish we could always represent God perfectly by forgiving our neighbor, being patient with a friend, or graciously losing a hard fought game. Christ's death and resurrection bought us and sanctified us even on our worst days. It is a difficult lesson to learn that we represent God at all times. We cannot take off time from representing God, and we can rejoice that God's justification saves us at all times.
