Jesus is...the Messiah, the Christ

John 1:41 "We have found the Messiah" (that is, the Christ).

Many expressions of love and affection will be exchanged once again this Valentine¢ Day. Yet, there is no greater act of love than the life, death and resurrection of Christ Jesus for our salvation. The whole of Scripture revolves around this one supreme act of unconditional love!

But why is it that Christians associate the title *Christ* with God¢ love in Jesus? What does the word *Christ* mean? A look at God¢ Word will help explain this. The Gospel of Matthew begins by recording the genealogy of Jesus, ‰ and Jacob the father of Joseph, the husband of Mary, of whom was born Jesus, who is called Christ.+(Matthew 1:16).

As Matthew sets the tone for his Gospel, he is careful to note that Jesus was revered as *Christ*. This familiar title is actually a form of the Greek word *chrio* meaning **%** pour or anoint.+To anoint was to pour sacred oil over someone's head as a visible sign that God had set him aside for a special task. Jesus bore the title *Christ* because he was the one God anointed to be the world**\$** Savior.

The Gospel of John in the first chapter reveals Jesus, the Word made flesh, and describes Andrewos excitement at having met Jesus: % the first thing Andrew did was to find his brother Simon and tell him, $\frac{1}{2}$ We have found the Messiahq(that is, the Christ)+(John 1:41). Andrew bursts forth in joyful acclamation, using the title *Messiah* which is the Hebrew equivalent of *Christ*, % he Anointed One.+

The Gospel writer John is keen to point out that from the beginning of Jesusqpublic ministry the hope of the ages was intimately associated with salvation in Jesus. Yes, at the time of his baptism Jesus was consecrated for his messianic ministry in a remarkable wayõ % eaven was opened, and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and lighting on him. And a voice from heaven said, "This is my Son, whom I love; with him I am well pleased" (Matthew 3:16-17). Jesus was anointed by the Spirit of God and received the clear approval of his heavenly Father. Talk about divine endorsement!

Because Jesus is *The Anointed One*, he is the one foretold in ancient prophecy who would bring salvation, redeeming us from the curse of sin! There is no greater act of love. true love! Now that a magnificent valentine!

Zion Evangelical Lutheran Church, Chesaning, Michigan SUMMARY OF COORDINATING COUNCIL MINUTES Tuesday, January 14, 2014 at 8:00 p.m.

The meeting was opened with devotion on the **G**Id and New Covenant+by Pastor Thomford. **Pastor's Report:** No membership changes.

Reports of Officers and Boards:

- Our Financial Secretary, Joe Donovan, reported that he has received so far in the current fiscal year \$164,542.54 from July 1 through December 31, 2013. This comes to an average to \$5,354 per Sunday for the first 26th Sundays of our fiscal year. Our budget requires that we need \$5,360 to meet our budget. We have fallen each week \$6. He reports that we are currently \$156 under budget for the first 26 Sundays of this year.
- Our Treasurer, Robert Wille, reported that he has received \$164104.54 in offering from our Financial Secretary. He reports we are holding approximately \$35,000 in unpaid bills.
- School Board Chairman Bill Hedrich reported that School has had 5 snow days this year and will eliminate one vacation day to make up for snow days. The Board is still looking into some guidance into setting up financial aid for parents needing help with tuition at Zion Lutheran School. The Board is looking in to the purchase of a new sign to replace the sign in the driveway since it is deteriorating. The colors for the combined sports team of Christ and Zion will be black and gold. The schools are still discussing a mascot choice.
- The EldersqBoard Chairman, Denny Peters, reported they have two new members and the Elders Board explained to them how the EldersqBoard works.
- Property Board Chairman, Ray Klipper, reported that the Property Board is looking into restoring the hardwood floor under the altar sanctuary of church.
- Evangelism Board Chairman, Dave Huggard, reported that since we were located at the Peet Center for the Candle Walk we had an increase in contacts this year.

NEW BUSINESS:

- The Council discussed the bid from Quackenbush Heating & Cooling which was a bid of \$46,029. The board also spoke to Brian Rohac via conference call. Brian recommended that the council check on forced air systems. He also suggested checking into the warranties offered on the systems we are considering, and he also recommended checking on repair cost of the systems.
- **Taxes:** Pastor Thomford and Matthew Augustine ask that the Council adopt a motion to allow Pastor Thomford and Matthew Augustine to set their housing allowance at \$5000, rental value of the parsonage/ teacherage at \$400/month, and business expense not reimbursed at \$2000. This does not affect their salary in anyway but does allow them to gain tax advantage for how their salary appears on the W-2 form. The Council adopted this for the 2014 calendar year.
- Pastor Thomford reported that Karen Boyd has asked to step down from her duty as Organist after many years of faithful service. Pastor Thomford asked the Council how we could thank her for her many years of faithful devotion as an organist for Zion.
- **Sanctuary:** Pastor Thomford asked the council to consider not replacing the communion rails since they are no longer in use and to restore the hardwood floors.




LUTHERAN WOMEN'S MISSIONARY SOCIETY NEWS

Beautiful Savior, Aloha, Oregon, is under the guidance of its second pastor, Rev. Chris Cordes, who shepherds the flock of just over 100 souls. Members work in fields ranging from automotive and construction to education and high tech. They are spread across the age spectrum, with the average age being 33. Some have been known to travel two hours to arrive at church.

Gospel ministry in Oregon faces a culture obstacle of people trying to escape religion in pursuit of happiness. Natures treasures abound here: Portlands rainforest, mountains to the east, and the ocean to the west. As one of the most unchurched places in the United States, gospel work here can be like plowing a parking lot.

A solid core of faithful believers sees as their purpose is to be and to train devoted followers of Christ. They know the most important growth is where our Savior is at the center of life. As they work to show that unchurched people matter to God, the congregation also teaches people to live an authentic faith life and to develop spiritually healthy families. They pray this foundation spreads in and through them, expanding their ministries.

In November the Pregnancy Counseling Center moved into a full-sized facility with two counseling rooms, full basement and space for clothing and infant furniture! In 2013 we took almost 500 client calls and shared God's word with every client and their guest/s. 29 ladies took pregnancy tests. 364 clients came for practical assistance: diapers, clothing, baby furniture, items you had generously donated. We handed out 46 Bibles. 31 of our clients heard the Good News of Baptism for their new babies. And we are open more hours! This month we began a Point System to encourage our clients to learn Godøs



Word. Clients earn points by completing Bible study books, meeting with a pastor, having their children baptized and many other opportunities to become involved with Godø Word! They can redeem their accumulated points for \$5 gas gift cards, new clothing, new pac n plays and other new baby furniture. Donations of these items are critical to continuing this vital program.


Congregational Mission Offering December 2013 Comparison with 2012


