

JESUS IS...OUR RIGHTEOUSNESS

Jeremiah 23:6

*In his days Judah will be saved and Israel will live in safety.
This is the name by which he will be called: The LORD Our Righteousness.*

There is nothing that feels better than a crisp, clean set of clothes. I've been trying to take up running this summer. After I come in from a three mile run, my shirt is gross! It's smelly and drenched with sweat. It feels so good, after I've showered, to put on a shirt that is dry and clean.

We have all made our *spiritual* clothes sweaty, dirty and gross. Our unkind words and self-centered thoughts are like mud caked on our spiritual shirts. God is not going to let us into his house (heaven) wearing those kind of clothes!

But there is nothing that feels better than a crisp, clean set of clothes! Jesus lived a completely righteous life. His spiritual clothes were never stained with a single sin. And then he said to you, "Change shirts with me." He put on your shirt that was stained with sin, and in exchange he gave you his crisp, clean shirt. That's what the Bible means when it says, "God made him who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God" (2 Corinthians 5:21).

Jesus was wearing our sinful clothes when he suffered and died on the cross. In exchange, he gave us his sinless clothes. Now, when God looks at us, he does not see dirty, sinful clothes. Instead, he sees the crisp, clean clothes of Jesus. The Bible puts it this way: "He has clothed me with garments of salvation and arrayed me in a robe of righteousness" (Isaiah 61:10).

We haven't lived a perfect life, but Jesus has. And he lets that perfect life count for us. He is "The LORD *Our* Righteousness," (Jeremiah 23:6). Because Jesus' perfect life (his righteousness) counts for us, that means that we can get into heaven!

So the next time you finish some strenuous activity, remember with joy that Jesus put on your grimy, sinful clothes. And when you open your dresser and find a neatly folded shirt, remember that Jesus has put a fresh, clean shirt on you. You are clothed in his perfect righteousness, and there is nothing that feels better than a crisp, clean set of clothes!

SUMMARY OF COORDINATING COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES JUNE 17, 2014

- Chairman Dave Mose called the meeting to order.
- Pastor Thomford opened the meeting with a devotion.

REPORTS


- Pastor's report: The Coordinating Council accepted the Elder's recommendation to release from membership Katrina McLaughlin, Storm Schmidt, and Brooke Willson. The Council also transferred Jodie Danek to Christ Our Savior Lutheran Church in Rockford, MI.
- Financial Officer Joe Donovan reported that in the first eleven months of the 2013—2014 fiscal year, he received \$279,597.35. Last year's budget was approximately \$101 dollars/week behind, which equals about \$5,000 under budget.
- Treasurer Robert Wille reported that he had received \$297,822.10 from the financial secretary for the first eleven months of the current fiscal year. He also reported that he is holding approximately \$42,000.00 in unpaid bills.
- School Board Chairman Bill Hedrich reported that, with the use of donated money, ads for Zion Lutheran School have been placed on Facebook and yard signs advertising the benefits of the school have been ordered. Soccer Camp registration has begun, and the 2014-2015 school calendar has been approved.
- Elder's Board Chairman Denny Peters reported that a visitation has been planned to visit inactive members on Sunday, June 22.
- Property Board Manager Ray Klipper reported that there are currently some problems with drainage at the Duplex. The Property Board will be digging up the drain tile in the summer. They also plan to re-roof the Education Wing sometime in September, and two dates were tentatively scheduled: Saturday, September 20th and Saturday, September 27th.
- No reports from: Evangelism Board, Family Ministry Board, or Adult Discipleship Board.

OLD BUSINESS

- Ray Klipper is currently working with Brian Rohac to obtain a bid for a forced-air system for the church from Mauer Heating and Cooling in Owosso.
- Joe Donovan will continue to explore methods for people to give offerings online. Both Pastor Thomford and Joe Donovan will report on this in the future.

NEW BUSINESS

- Pastor Thomford asked the Council if he could still take his previously scheduled vacation for Sunday, July 20th and Sunday, July 27th in light of the fact that he has spent time tending to his ill father in Minnesota over the past few weeks. This matter was further complicated because the guest speaker previously scheduled for those days had to withdraw due to health reasons. The Council reiterated to Pastor Thomford that he should still take his vacation time. The Council resolved that members of the Council will do the liturgies on those Sundays if Pastor Thomford could obtain video sermons to show in place of a guest speaker.
- Principal Matthew Augustine gave a status report on the meetings that we're having with Christ in Oakley in regard to a possible joint school in the future.
- No Council, Elder's, or Board meetings in July. The next meeting will take place on the evening of August 19th.
- The meeting closed with Luther's Evening Prayer.



SUMMARY OF VOTER'S MEETING, June 8, 2014

- 21 men gathered at school for a meal.
- Afterward, the meeting opened with a devotion by Pastor Thomford.
- Financial Secretary Joe Donovan reported that we were approximately \$100/Sunday behind for the current fiscal year.
- Church Treasurer Robert Wille reported that he was currently holding \$42,000.00 in unpaid bills, \$12,000.00 that are due for pensions.
- School Board Chairman Bill Hedrich reported that a new driveway sign for the school has been donated. They are in need of volunteers to mow the school lawn in the summer. The school board has also started a Tuition Assistance Fund for those families who attend Zion Lutheran School and need some financial aid to pay their tuition costs and school fees.
- Elder's Board Chairman Denny Peters reported that they had a successful year in visiting members of the congregation.
- Property Board Chairman Ray Klipper reported that the Property Board would like to re-roof the Education Wing at church during the last two Saturdays in September.
- Adult Discipleship Chairman Tom Hoover reported that there is a possible Zion camp-out for the summer of 2014.

OLD BUSINESS

- The Council is still waiting for reports for a forced-air system for the church and the Education Wing.

NEW BUSINESS

- The Coordinating Council proposed that the congregation adopt a budget of \$274,577.00 for the 2014-2015 budget. The Voters amended the budget because of payroll taxes to a budget of \$277,077. It was unanimously accepted by the voters.
- The meeting closed with Luther's Morning prayer.

GOD BLESS AMERICA

The following is a question and answer with Dawn Orta, a captain in the U.S. Army stationed at Fort Hood, Texas. When Orta's unit was called up to deploy to southwest Asia, preparations for their departure had them working 14-hour days and weekends. The following interview gave this busy wife and mother a rare chance to sit down and reflect on what military life entails.

THE MOUNTING DISTRESS

Question: Describe some of the difficulties faced daily by soldiers in the military.

Answer: Lack of control of your life. Although the military does give you some choice where you will serve, you aren't always able to choose where you will live and what job you will perform. The position to which you were assigned may not have anything to do with the training you have received.

Question: Has the military taught you any life lessons that you feel you may not have learned anywhere else?

Answer: Definitely. I have learned independence and how to fire a weapon. I still don't like it, but if I hadn't joined the military, I don't think I would have ever fired a weapon voluntarily. I have also learned to be more assertive and to take on more responsibility. Most often, in the civilian world, people will only take on what they can handle. In the military, you are put in positions that you didn't choose and find it's your responsibility to fix them.

Question: What questions go through your mind as you think about deployment? What challenges might you and your family face?

Answer: Uncertainty of what will happen. Is life or death in store for me? I think that I certainly could be killed in a car crash tomorrow if it is the time God has chosen to take me to heaven. However, upon entering a hostile area where there will be bombs and bullets flying, the threat of death seems more up front.

What will I have to face as a woman in a Muslim country where women are treated like cattle or worse? What will happen to me, a Christian woman, if I become a prisoner of war? What conflicts will I have because of my Christianity? Will I be able to practice my faith? We heard that during Desert Storm soldiers had to take off crosses. Will I be asked to do the same? How will I respond to what I experience visually, biologically, or chemically? Will my kids be well taken care of, or will they have permanent emotional or psychological effects because I am leaving?

THE PROMISED DELIVERANCE

Question: What comfort do you find in God's Word to help you as you deal with these emotions?

Answer: I guess there isn't one passage in particular that keeps me going. I just remember the promise of God to always be with me no matter where I go. In times when I feel weak, I remember that God is carrying me along. God is always with me, and I have the reassurance of my ultimate destination—heaven.

Question: How do you handle the uncertainty of not knowing where or when you will be called to serve?

Answer: At times it is certainly aggravating and stressful. But I just try to remember that God is in control. As things evolve with Iraq, I know that God has a hand in it. No matter what happens, I cannot control my life, but God can.

I say a prayer of thanks for all the Dawn Ortas who are defending the freedoms we take for granted every day. A prayer of thanks for the lesson that Dawn teaches us: even though her heart is heavy with uncertainty, she has her eyes focused on Christ and his ability to carry her through every situation, no matter how dark.



WISCONSIN EVANGELICAL LUTHERAN SYNOD


Congregational Mission Offering May 2014 Comparison with 2013

UPDATED BUDGET

21 men attended the Annual Voters' Meeting on Sunday, June 8th, 2014. Joe Donovan reported that he had received \$279,597 in offerings from God's people during the 2013-2014 fiscal year. Our Treasurer, Robert Wille, reported that he is holding approximately \$42,000 in unpaid bills (This includes \$12,000 for pensions). The Coordinating Council proposed a budget of \$274,577. The voters discussed each line of the budget and noted that budget line for payroll taxes was low by \$2,500. \$2,500 was added to the budget. After further discussion the Voters approved a \$277,077 budget for the 2014-2015 fiscal year. This will require approximately \$5,328 per Sunday during the next fiscal year. Below is the updated budget for the 2014-2015 fiscal year.
