

JESUS IS: KING OF KINGS AND LORD OF LORDS

Revelation 19:16
"On his robe and on his thigh he has this name written:
KING OF KINGS AND LORD OF LORDS."

We live in a world that is often affected by tragedy and disaster. Terrorist attacks, war, crime, disease, natural disasters—these are just some of the evils that affect our world. As sinful people living in a sinful world, these are sad realities that we must sometimes face. Even if we aren't directly affected by any great tragedy, problems still affect us all.

Evil in the world around us and problems in our own lives can make us afraid. They can make us feel weak and helpless. Sometimes evil seems to have the upper hand. Sometimes it seems like this world is out of control. We might wonder, "Where is God? Who is in control?"

Our Savior Jesus is in control. The Bible assures us, "The Lamb will overcome them because he is Lord of lords and King of kings—and with him will be his called, chosen and faithful followers" (Revelation 17:14). Jesus, "the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world," is King and Lord supreme. He is in control of all things. He rules for the good of his people. His ultimate goal is to bring us safely to our eternal home in heaven.

The evidence of his rule is seen in God's plan for our salvation. On the cross, Jesus conquered sin, death and the devil. He wasn't caught off guard and forced to die. COORDINATING COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES TUESDAY, AUGUST 19, 2014

1. The Coordinating Council met on Tuesday, August 19, and opened with devotion.

2. REPORTS OF OFFICERS AND BOARDS

- Financial secretary Joe Donovan reported that we fell behind \$5,000.00 for the first four weeks of this fiscal year.
- Church treasurer Robert Wille reported that he is currently holding about \$44,000.00 in unpaid bills.
- School Board Chairman Bill Hedrich reported that the soccer camp went well this year. The carpets were cleaned professionally this year with donations from the teachers. Karen Boyd will be giving piano lessons this year at Zion Lutheran School. The Board approved the school to take off November 26 (the Wednesday before Thanksgiving) instead of a day in February.
- Elder's Board chairman Dennis Peters reported that they continue to call on inactive members. They also reported that they had given Pastor Thomford permission to begin holding children's devotions during church services starting in September.

3. OLD BUSINESS

- No new bids on the heating and cooling situation at church have been offered.
- Joe Donovan reported that we are continuing to research a method of electronic giving and are working with a bank in town. This would allow members to designate regular offerings through automatic withdrawals or enable individuals to donate through the church website.

4. NEW BUSINESS

- The Church Council gave permission for Pastor Thomford and Principal Augustine to present a proposal to the congregation that would expand ministry at Zion Lutheran School to include 5-day Kindergarten and 5-day Preschool.
- The Council gave permission for Pastor Thomford to be a guest speaker at an Evangelism Sunday at Trinity Lutheran Church in Saline on September 28. A guest preacher will preach at Zion that weekend and will be paid for by the WELS Evangelism Office.
- Pastor Thomford asked for approval to be gone on Sunday, October 12, 2014 so he could help settle some of his father's affairs in Minnesota. This was approved.
- The Nominating Committee was approved, and will begin preparing a list of candidates for the December elections. Their first meeting will be on October 2 at 7:00 pm at church.
- 5. The meeting closed with Luther's Evening prayer.

LUTHERAN WOMEN'S MISSIONARY SOCIETY NEWS

"You are welcome in the name of the Lord. We are truly glad to see you."

This is one of the welcoming songs often sung by Nigerian Lutherans for visiting WELS fellow Christians. In fact, "Welcome!" is the most common greeting any visitor hears anywhere in Nigeria. There are physical risks in visiting this country of 170 million, but you couldn't enjoy a warmer welcome anywhere. And so it is that the Gospel message shared by Lutherans in Nigeria for the past 76 years have been welcomed with open arms.

Students and faculty of Christ the King Lutheran Seminary welcome a team of 18 volunteer WELS pastors who in pairs alternate with two Nigerian pastors teaching at the Seminary. Saviour, Sylvester, Samuel E. Agwu, Vincent, Michael, Joseph, Happiness, Stephen, Wonah, Idorenyin, and Samuel U. welcome the blessing of studying for the Lutheran ministry. As God blesses them, they will graduate in early 2015, five for Christ the King Lutheran Church and seven for All Saints Lutheran Church. These two Nigerian sister synods thank LWMS and WELS for spiritual encouragement and for gifts to the Nigeria Fund. This fund provides the entire cost of their six-year seminary program.

Please keep those who study to be teachers and pastors at Martin Luther College and Wisconsin Lutheran Seminary in your prayers, as well as those studying in Nigeria. To God be the glory!

 - The more effective way to support this ministry would be through direct contributions, since United Way uses 10-15% of the gift to cover their administrative costs.



WISCONSIN EVANGELICAL LUTHERAN SYNOD


Congregational Mission Offering May 2014 Comparison with 2013

OPEN FORUM ON A PROPOSAL TO EXPAND PRESCHOOL AND KINDERGARTEN: An open

forum will be held on Sunday morning, September 21, 2014 during Bible Class to discuss the possibility of adding five full days of Kindergarten and five full days of 3-4 year old preschool to Zion's Lutheran Elementary School. This also includes a before and after school latchkey program.

(Zion's Elementary School currently offers Kindergarten 3 full days/week and 3-4 year old preschool on just two 1/2 days each week.) The Coordinating Council has given Pastor Thomford and Principal Augustine permission to present a preliminary plan for such expansion and a possible method for funding this expansion. The open forum is open to men and women of the congregation to listen and to also ask questions about this plan. We would like to especially invite those families who have kindergarten and preschool aged children and younger so that they would have the opportunity to ask questions and offer input about this preliminary plan.



SCHOOL OF OUTREACH: Our Evangelism Board would like to invite the members of Zion to join them for a School of Outreach at St. Paul's Livonia on Saturday, October 4, 2014, from 10:00am—3:30pm. A School of Outreach is a two-day seminar (one Saturday in the Fall and one Saturday in the Spring) to help congregations gear up for evangelism. The seminar is open to men, women, and children of the congregation. During the seminar you will listen to presentations, but more importantly, our congregation will have the opportunity to draft a plan for evangelism in planning sessions. PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

For nearly ten years, Zion has held a Soccer/Bible camp in early August, and for nearly ten years it has been an opportunity to bring un-churched prospects onto our campus. This year was like many others, as we had roughly ninety campers and nearly twenty teen volunteers who helped with coaching. Registration forms show that at least one in three families who participated this year had no church home nor had they attended a camp before. On many accounts the camp was a success. Near record attendance, hard-working and independent volunteers, and the fact that more school brochures and Zion information was distributed than previous years would all seem to point to an effective camp experience. But how can we measure the success on a spiritual scale?

During camp week, we taught every student a Bible lesson every day. We handed out flyers showing how Christ affects our ministry. Yet, we have not experienced any flood of new members or students at our school. We tend to look—sometimes desperately—for outward signs of success. However, God has not called us to be successful in this earthly life, he has instead called us to be faithful followers of his Word. We work for God, spreading the Gospel, and must trust the Holy Spirit to do the rest of the work. No matter how hard we look for signs of our work, we may never see the seed of faith that was planted.

When the work of the church seems fruitless, the words of the Psalmist must be remembered, "My word will not return to me empty without accomplishing what I desire (Psalm 55:10)." We strive to be successful, but God needs us to be faithful in sharing and living the word so that his Word can "accomplish what he desires." *Upcoming events or recent news from Zion School is shown below:*

CAMPBELL'S LABELS FOR EDUCATION






